## Shayrat Airbase – Update on US Missile Attack 7th Apr 2017 Analysis by Tim Ripley

The Following presentations is drawn from Russian MOD and Media footage filmed

on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2017, as well as US DoD satellite imagery

## Assessment

The airbase was "hardened" in the 1970s by the Soviets after the Israeli surprise attack wiped out the Syrian air force in the 1967 war. There is a mix of single aircraft HAS and double or pair HAS which can take two aircraft in each bay. There are a total of 40 HAS on the base.

The footage appears to show missile hits and penetrations of at least 18 hardened shelters (HAS) It is not possible to assess damage inside most of shelters or if aircraft were hit. One picture shows the burnt out remains of 3 aircraft inside a pair of shelters

Two HAS appears to have debris blasted out of their front doors.

Just under half of the 40 HAS on the base appear to have been damaged or destroyed.

The two main runways are undamaged, apart from some superficial shrapnel damage. It has not been cratered.

No Russian helicopters appear to have been at the base, although satellite imagery from January shows Russian helicopters there to support the Palmyra offensive.

The SA-6 battery positioned just outside the main gate appears untouched by the US missile strike, with four missile launcher vehicles and a radar operational

The airbase remains operational, after only suffering limited damage

## Shayrat Airbase — Support Infra-structure Damage to airbase

SA-6 (also known as Kub) Air Defence Missile sites around Shayrat.

The five sites appear not to have been active from several months, with missile launcher vehicles not deployed in firing sites. The Syrians were not expecting an attack
